We are interested in vintage photos and negatives, as well as digital scans of relevant images. Maps, postcards, passports, and civil and religious documents are also within the scope of the collection. Families may submit family histories and family group sheets. At this time PARI is not purchasing materials, and asks that a donation accompany the collection to purchase the appropriate archival materials which assure safe, secure, and long-term preservation. Staff members can be consulted in regard to related costs.

Objects and archival materials, including photographs, are primarily added to the collection through donation. If you have something you would like to donate, please contact the Polish Mission and we would be glad to consider it. Please send us a description of the item, as much background information as you can provide, and a photograph of the item if possible. Not all offered items are accepted due to space, preservation requirements, or other factors. If we cannot accommodate your donation, we will recommend other potential museums for your consideration. Donors may elect to claim the value of their donations as tax-deductible contributions within limits as established by Internal Revenue Service codes. Donors are responsible for establishing the value of their own donations. The Polish Mission, as a matter of policy, does not provide appraisals for donated items.
