



Determine status during and prior to the Civil War. Free person of color Never slave, purchased freedom, or manumitted Follow basic research techniques Remember the records may be segregated

Determine status during and prior to the Civil War.

- Married into, adopted by, or owned by Native American Tribe
 - Freedom followed the mother
 - Escaped slaves, free persons of color
 - Study Native American History
 - Usually stayed with the tribe when freed
 - Records are Federal
 - Bureau of Indian Affairs
 - National Archives Branches

Determine status during and prior to the Civil War.

- Slave
 - Referred to in records by first name
 - Families sold away from each other
 - Freed slaves could take name from owner, plantation, or one of their choosing

Resources -- Slave Schedules

- **1850**, 1860
- Only owners listed
- Slaves listed by sex and age, occasionally by first name

Resources -- Military

- Colored Troops on both sides
- Record could show owner
- Record could contain affidavits of slave's life history
- Owners were paid bounty if slave enlisted or was drafted
- Colored troops received their enlistment bounty after the war ended - Union
