Castle Garden

• Date of arrival

• Just an index – no ships' manifests online yet (check with Family History Library, Family History Center, Ancestry or the National Archive)

Age at arrival

# **Tips for Using Castle Garden**

- Wildcard \* For example: Deb\*
- Debbe, Debbie, Debby, etc.

### What Each Database Index Contains

• Name

• Sex • Last Residence

**Unable To Locate Your Ancestors?** 

Use Stephen Morse's web site <a href="http://stevemorse.org/">http://stevemorse.org/</a>

- Not all immigrants came to New York (Check other ports)
- Look for departure lists
- They may not have come together as a family usually the father goes first and then rest of the family comes later
- It is possible they might have come through Canada which was cheaper

# **Ancestors' Name Might Have Been Spelled**

- Don't limit yourself to a single spelling
- Did your ancestor "Americanize" his name? Koch Cook or Giovanni John
- Search by last name & first initial only
- Check for women under their maiden names
- Check all other family members
- Search for other passengers
- Reverse the first and last names
