- State Land States: Metes and bounds
 - "...twenty rods to the ash tree thence west fifty rods to Powell's creek...
- Public-land States:Rectangular survey system
 - "SE1/4 Sec. 10 T29N R16W of the 6th PM"


Early Colonists

- "Occupancy and Use"
 - based on the doctrine that living there and using the property made it yours
- Continued to present day
 - homesteading: "cultivate and settle"
 - pre-emptors: "cultivate and settle"

Early Land Companies

- London Company
 - granted rights to settle 34°-41° north latitude
- Plymouth Company
 - granted rights to settle 38°-45° north latitude
- Virginia Company
 - lands: Old Point Comfort, to the Pacific Ocean
- New England Council
 - lands: 40°-48° north latitude, and "sea to sea"
- Massachusetts Bay Company
 - present-day Commonwealth of Mass., west

New England, Virginia



Origin of the term: Townships

- Conn., Mass., R.I. were corporations
 - 30 families given a land grant
 - survey done for a "town"
 - · rectangles of 6-10 miles laid ou
 - allotted according to each family's need
 - title given, couldn't be sold without group permission
 - · common boundaries
 - survey first, occupy later
- Other colonies followed this pattern

Colonial restrictions

- Quitrent
 - payment to the grantor
- Primogeniture
 - eldest inherits all
- Entail
 - lineal descendants only inherit
 - entailed land cannot be sold

1780s

- 1781: Articles of Confederation
- 1783: Treaty of Paris
 - · Ended the Revolutionary War
 - The United States of America exists

Articles of Confederation

 Maryland: "The back Lands claimed by the British Crown, if secured by the blood and treasure of all, ought in reason, justice, and policy...be considered as a common stock."

Articles of Confederation

 Congress: "...the unappropriated lands that may be ceded or relinquished to the United States...shall be disposed of for the common benefit of the United States."

Conflicting Opinions

- Hamilton: "Sell it to anyone for highest price"
 - Large parcels at low prices
 - Patent and survey their properties
- Jefferson: "Give every man the opportunity"
 - Small parcels at low prices
 - Survey first, sell later

Land Ordinance of 1785


- "...surveyors...shall...divide... into townships of 6 miles square,..."

- "...and exactly described on a plat..."
- "...subdivisions...640 acres...numbered 1 to 36"
- "...No. 16...for the maintenance of public schools"


Northwest Ordinance of 1787


- Eliminated primogeniture and entail
- Provided for territorial governors, judges
 - Officials needed to be landowners and residents
- Northwest Territory be divided into 3-5 states
 - set pattern for organization of statehood
- Slavery outlawed


