

Episode 18: Get Help from Others Researching the Same Name

5 minute challenge—**Choose an ancestor** you're having trouble finding. Spend 5 minutes online!

Steps:

1. **Check** online forums and message boards for surname searches.

2. **Subscribe** to a surname mailing list. There's a good chance you're related to someone else who has subscribed.

3. Search library catalogs for published histories. If you

find someone publishing information about your ancestor, it's a good bet he or she has more information about other ancestors.

4. **Contact** societies. Usually for



the price of the membership, you will receive a publication with lists of names and contact information of people who have made inquiries.

Helpful hints:

Working with another person is a great way to do your genealogy. Each of you may have access to different information, which can allow you to cover more ground and broaden the search.

Vocabulary

Forum:

A website for people to post and read messages, questions and answers, usually for a specific topic or area of interest

Mailing List:

A list of names and addresses of people who have subscribed to receive requested information periodically.

Genealogical Society:

A society that allows society members and others to share family history information and knowledge, often historical in nature.
