

Episode 8: Find a Record

5 Minute Challenge—Find a record using a catalog or FamilySearch Center

Steps:

- 1. Make sure you know your ancestors' name, time period they lived in, and where they lived.
- Look at free online records at FamilySearch.org.
- 3. Search the Family History Library Catalog.
- 4. Search the FamilySearch Wiki for record types and locations for your ancestors' area.
- 5. Visit a FamilySearch Center.



How to find a FamilySearch Center near you:

- Visit FamilySearch.org, and click the FamilySearch Centers tab.
- 2. Enter your city, state, postal code or country and click **Search**.
- Select a center near you by clicking the FamilySearch logo.
- 4. Make note of the center's address, hours of operations, and phone number.

Call before going to make sure someone will be there to assist you.

Vocabulary

Microfilm:

Images taken of original documents. Often available in family history center and libraries.

Catalog:

A guide to all of the various records in their various forms held by FamilySearch.org



How to search the Family History Library Catalog:

- 1. Visit familysearch.org, and click Catalog.
- Search place-names by typing the name of the place your ancestor lived in, and press Search.
- 3. Select the type of record you are interested in.
- 4. Select the item to learn about availability and format.

5. Order the item to be sent to your local FamilySearch Center.
