Service Records

- General Index to Compiled Service Records of the Revolutionary War, National Archives (archives.gov)
 - This alphabetical index includes soldiers, sailors, and members of Army staff departments and civilian employees of the Army and Navy (such as teamsters, carpenters and cooks). For each soldier or civilian, the index gives name, rank, unit, and profession or office. (description – nehgs.org)
- Index to Revolutionary War Service Records, V. White
- Compiled Service Records of Soldiers who Served in the American Army During the Revolutionary War, National Archives M881
 - Arranged first by state, then by regiment, and finally, by surname. In addition to the information given in the index, the record usually provides dates of entry into the service and indicates if a soldier was discharged or separated by desertion or death. It may also show the soldier's age, place of birth, and residence at the time of enlistment. (Description - nehgs.org)
