## Family History Consultants

### 1. Video 1- Helping Members with Various Needs

- Objectives:
  - Demonstrate how to assist a variety of members including:
    - New Members
      - Help them get to the temple as soon as possible. (New converts who prepare names and go to the temple soon after baptism for their own family members are very likely to remain active in the Church.)
      - Make sure they understand the doctrine – they could be the best hope for their ancestor to receive saving ordinances.
      - Help them create a four generation pedigree chart – add it to the tree.
    - Less-active members
      - them to talk about their own families, which can help them feel the Spirit.
      - Invite them to a class or a workshop, which can be a non-threatening way to help them participate in gospel related activities.
      - them to prepare a name for temple work which can turn their hearts, help them understand the purpose of the Church, and motivate them to return to activity.
    - Youth/YSA/Perspective Missionaries
      - Help perspective missionaries fulfill their assignment to learn some stories about their ancestors and prepare a 4-generation chart.
      - Let the youth lead their own family history activities. Provide support as needed, but don't take over.
      - Encourage the youth to tie in temple and family history to activities, conferences, and Duty to God or Personal Progress projects.
    - Individuals with limited access/technical knowledge
      - Help them record their living memory using paper if necessary.
      - Introduce the helper function.
      - If needed, you can enter the information for them.

- Investigators/non-members
  - Work one on one with or teach a workshop for investigators, as referred by the missionaries and coordinated through ward leaders.
  - Be prepared to discuss why the Church does family history work
  - those of other faiths who inquire about the purpose of family history in the Church to meet with the missionaries.
