



American State Papers → Bill enacted in 1830 to publish papers of the first Thirteen Congresses, 1789-1817 → Organized in ten subject groups Foreign Relations Indian Affairs Military Affairs Commerce/Navigation Finance Naval Affairs Post Office Depts. Public Lands Claims Miscellaneous


Examples Damages for losses during war Correction of a military record Increases to pensions Indian depredation claims Registering foreign land grant












What's next? Papers found in the Serial Set are summaries of action taken. Each deposition, each form of proof is filed with the bill in the National Archives in Washington, D.C. The Serial Set provides the citation needed to request copies of this information



What's next? → Records are not under the Freedom of Information Act, but the spirit of this act is enforced. → Documents containing personal data are kept private for 30 (House) to 50 (Senate) years.
